


Stage 2 Submitted to the MOHLTC

NWHC’s Stage 2 functional programs outlining the Louise Marshall Hospital (LMH) ER/Ambulatory Care expansion and Palmerston & District Hospital’s (PDH) Medical Education space were submitted to the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care (MOHLTC) for review. The Stage 2 submission outlines functions, operations, staffing, major equipment, rooms and space requirements for the capital projects.

The submission included schematic architectural plans based on current and future patient volumes and staffing requirements.

Multiple stakeholders provided input into the Stage 2 submission. Following MOHLTC and the Waterloo Wellington Local Health Integrated Network approvals the capital projects will move to Stage 3 planning – detailed design planning.

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The Competitive Tendering Process

How do we select a General Contractor (GC) for the capital projects? It is called a “tendering process”.

This is a 2 step process beginning with a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) which helps us identify Contractors who have proven, through similar projects, that they can complete the work on time, on budget and meet our quality standards.

All submissions are reviewed and scored. This scoring allows us to create a pre-qualified list of Contractors capable of completing the project.

The second step is the Request for Proposals (RFP) which is comprised of tender documents which provide project information to the Contractors for their bids. These will, in turn, form part of the project contract.

The RFP is only issued to pre-qualified candidates successfully completing the RFQ process. All RFP submissions are then evaluated and scored against a pre-set scoring matrix to identify suitable General Contractors.

NWHC is approved to begin the tendering process in the fiscal 2014/15 year.

The Building Campaign is Making Great Strides

Mount Forest Louise Marshal Hospital Foundation’s capital campaign continues to make great strides in raising funds for the ER/Ambulatory care redevelopment.
